

Our Landfills <u>may</u> accept impacted soils at one of our landfills provided that they meet the criteria set out in the B.C. Ministry of Environment Contaminated Sites Regulation.

Any client wishing to dispose of impacted soils at a PRRD landfill must have the material in question tested for and compared to the <u>Industrial Levels of the parameters listed in Schedule 3.1 and 3.2</u>, as applicable in this regulation:

The client needs to have testing performed by an accredited analytical laboratory, signed off by a Contaminated Sites Approved Professional (CSAP)* and a letter from this professional must be submitted to PRRD**, stating that it met the aforementioned criteria.

**Note, a regular technician may do actual testing from an Accredited Lab, but the sampler and CSAP professional do not necessarily have to be the same person

Provided the criteria has been met and PRRD has received the letter from the CSAP professional, the Regional District could accept the material. The cost to dispose of impacted soils at the landfill is \$5 per tonne.

The client is to notify PRRD as to how much material will be coming in, so that the landfill contractor is prepared to accept the material (extremely important in the case of large quantities).

Notes:

*Contaminated Site Approved Professionals are familiar with the regulations and technical standards required as well as methods necessary to bring land back to the standards set out in the Environmental Management Act and Contaminated Sites Regulation.
