PRRD starts public engagement on new Regional Zoning Bylaw project



The Peace River Regional District (PRRD) has launched a public survey on accessory buildings, home-based business, secondary suite and detached suite regulations. This is the first step in developing a new Regional Zoning Bylaw. The survey invites public feedback to help shape the development of the new bylaw and guide future engagements.

“We’re creating a unified Regional Zoning Bylaw that reflects the needs and priorities of our communities and simplifies regulations,” said Board Chair Leonard Hiebert. “Public input is crucial to shape a new bylaw that will work for everyone in our region.”

Engagement Opportunities

The online survey is open from March 20 to May 30, 2025 at 4:30pm (PST). Registration is not required to participate and responses are anonymous. Hard copies of the survey are available at both PRRD offices in Dawson Creek (1981 Alaska Avenue) and Fort St. John (9505 100 Street).

PRRD invites Golata Creek residents to share their vision for potential community space

The Peace River Regional District is launching a public engagement project to help shape the future of the community space located at 6161 Golata Creek Road. Using information from community members, the Golata Creek Community Association and the PRRD Board will determine the future of the property through a collaborative process.

The Golata Creek Community Hall was built in 1958 and closed in July 2022 due to safety concerns related to its structural integrity. Engineering assessments found that repairs would cost too much. The PRRD Board has approved a budget of \$500,000 for potentially developing a new building or recreational space, dependent on community support through a referendum.

The PRRD invites residents to share their priorities for this community space and what that may look like.

A community meeting is scheduled for April 30, 2025, from 6:30 to 8:30 pm at the Clearview Arena in Goodlow.
