



Peace Project partner update - March 2017

The Peace Project, which aims to further the knowledge of groundwater in northeastern BC and enable more informed decisions on groundwater use, is about to enter its next phase.

Through late March and early April, eleven shallow water wells (approximately 40-60m deep and 6cm wide) will be drilled at sites including Charlie Lake, Lynx Creek and in the Halfway River valley listed below. Correlating information from these wells with results from previous aerial surveys will help to validate previous findings and further understanding of water resources across northeastern BC.

Once drilling is completed and core samples have been taken. With landowners' permission, we hope to be able to continue to monitor water levels at each site.

This latest phase of work follows publication of aerial surveys in 2016. This was followed by an analysis to select the sites suitable for the upcoming well-drilling. Links to the reports can be found here: <http://www.geosciencebc.com/s/PeaceProject.asp>
