PRRD invites input on Rose Prairie Water Station

The Peace River Regional District is hosting a community meeting for Electoral Area B residents on March 26, 2025, from 3pm to 5pm at Montney Recreation Hall. The meeting will provide updates on the Rose Prairie Water Station project and gather feedback.

Residents can submit questions via email before the meeting to environmental.services@prrd.bc.ca. A short online survey to collect feedback on proposed well sites is open from March 12 to April 2, 2025 at 4:30pm (MST). Paper copies of the survey will also be available at the community meeting.

Since 2018, the project has faced challenges, including water quality issues and treatment failures. New well drilling began in 2024 with grant funding, providing mixed results. Community input will guide future drilling and help to inform the next steps by the Regional Board.

Regional Climate Resiliency Plan draft unveiled to the public for feedback

The Peace River Regional District has launched a survey to collect public feedback on its draft Regional Climate Resiliency Plan (RCRP). This effort addresses the increasing challenges from natural hazards like wildfires, floods, extreme heat, drought and storms, intensified by climate change.

The RCRP evaluates risks and proposes strategies to boost the region's resilience. Public engagement is crucial, with the draft presented to the Regional Board on March 6, 2025, marking the final review phase.

PRRD's Regional Growth Strategy enters final review phase

The Peace River Regional District has reached a major milestone with the completion of the first draft of the Regional Growth Strategy (RGS), a 20-year plan to tackle challenges like population growth, service demands, economic changes and climate impacts.

Created with input from a Steering Committee and provincial agencies, the RGS aims to align with regional and provincial goals to prepare for future challenges. Public input has been crucial in shaping this draft.

As the PRRD moves into the final public review phase, the focus is on refining the RGS based on community feedback. Residents are encouraged to review the draft and share their thoughts to ensure it meets community needs and supports sustainable growth. The RGS is expected to become a regional bylaw in July 2025.
